

Welcome to this Spring edition!

Council changes

Cllr Anne Claxton has recently resigned from Outseats Council. The Local Government Act 1972 allows casual vacancies to be filled by cooption, and the Council intends to do this at its May 20th meeting.

Outseats has a new Parish Clerk, Peter Leppard, who took over (from David Palmer) on 1st April. Peter lives in Bamford and previously worked for the railways for 33 years.

Long Causeway and Hurstclough Lane

The issues surrounding damage to these two historic lanes (and many others in the Peak District) by recreational motorised vehicles are high on the Peak District National Park Authority's (PDNPA) agenda, including the possible making of permanent Traffic Restriction Orders

(TROs) - but PDNPA's resources have been severely stretched by the recent legal challenge to their TRO on Chapel Gate (near Edale), which resulted in that TRO being guashed for technical procedural reasons. A permanent solution for Long Causeway and Hurstclough Lane therefore remains some way away. but Outseats Parish Council continues to press for action. One piece of good news is that the temporary TRO for 4-wheeled vehicles (but not motorbikes) on Long Causeway, to facilitate the County Council's repair works, has now been extended to 2015.

<u>Planning</u>

Since the last newsletter, Outseats Council has received notifications from PDNPA of, and has commented upon, planning applications for Cow Close Farm (Birley La), Gamekeeper's Cottage (Brookfield Manor), Brookfield Manor

itself, Riverside (Jaggers La) and Little Gate House (Gatehouse La). Final decisions by PDNPA on all of these are awaited.

Get composting!

If you hate having to buy compost, why not make your own? Composting is a cost-effective and natural process that transforms kitchen and garden waste into a valuable resource. Compost is a nutrient-rich food product for the garden which helps to improve soil structure, maintain moisture levels and keeps the soil's pH balance in check. More than a third of household waste is organic material which can be composted; grass cuttings, unwanted plants, cardboard, newspapers, and fruit & vegetable peelings are all ideal. Derbyshire County Council has a scheme which offers compost bins at £16.98 each, plus £5.49 delivery per order. They are made from recycled plastic, carry a 15-year guarantee, and don't require any putting together. Find out more at www.derbyshire.gov.uk/composting or call 0844 571 4444.

Swap and Save

A toolkit has been put together by Derbyshire County Council to help local organisations and groups run their own 'Give and Take' day, where people can give away good quality things they don't want or need anymore and pick up something they do – all for free. The toolkit is ideal if you run a community or voluntary group, or even if you just wanted to gather together a few friends for an afternoon. It includes tips on running a successful event, help with publicity

Review of County Council snow clearing over winter 2012/13

At its April meeting, the Parish Council reviewed the snow and ice clearance over the past winter, and considered that it had been generally good. The abnormally heavy snow which fell at the end of the winter. while inevitably disruptive to residents, was impressively dealt with by snow ploughs in a way which certainly would not have happened a few years ago; this much better performance is due to great improvements made by the County and much improved lines of communication which the Parish has set up with them.

Bill Miles

With sadness we learnt that Bill Miles, a past chairman of Outseats Council, passed away in April. Bill was a valued colleague and member of the Council for many years.

Local roads

It was disappointing to learn from the County Council recently, following their site visit - at which Parish Councillors were present - that they see insufficient case to make any road improvements to the pinch point of Main Rd near the chemist's shop. Residents who still feel unhappy about this should contact our County Councillor (details overleaf).

During the same visit, parking on Jaggers Lane up to Cannonfields was also discussed, as there have been numerous complaints regarding cars parked on the footpath. DCC agreed to repaint the yellow lines where they have become indistinct and also to consider extending the double yellow lines further up the hill, probably as far as the start of the Bund Wall.

A6187 closure

Main Rd/Sheffield Rd will be closed between 28-31 May for road repairs between the George Hotel and Fiddlers Elbow.

Hathersage swimming pool

The replacement boiler is now working, and the opening day of the new season in March was a great success - getting coverage in the national press because of the deep snow! Night swims are now a regular and successful part of the summer programme - dates for the rest of the season are Fridays 17 May, 21 June, 19 July, 16 August & 20 September. The 6.30 morning swims on Tuesdays & Thursdays (low season only) have also proved very popular, and the marketing team is busy coming up with more ideas for the pool.
